

Changes were made to the DSM-5 module and the LOCI. Added was an “At Risk” category to the DSM-5 module. This designation is available in the drop down in the Diagnostic Summary section if the client does not meet full criteria for any substance use diagnosis. If the client meets some criteria for a substance use disorder it would be helpful to note this information in the comment section of the accordion for the appropriate disorder/substance and then select “At Risk” in the First Diagnosis in the Diagnostic Summary section. If a client does meet full criteria for a substance use diagnosis, “At Risk” option will be disabled and will not appear in the drop down.

If “At Risk” is selected in the Diagnostic Summary section, the LOCI-3 will be enabled but the options for the level of care will be limited only to 0.5 – Early Intervention Services and admission module will not be enabled. This will allow a provider to provide the appropriate reports in a case where a client may be court ordered for treatment but where the assessment shows that only education/early intervention may be an appropriate intervention due to the client not meeting full criteria for a substance use diagnosis.

If a client meets has a co-occurring diagnosis but does not meet full criteria for a substance use diagnosis, both the co-occurring disorder and the “At Risk” designation will be available as options in the dropdown of the Diagnostic Summary section. Both should be selected in the Diagnostic Summary section and the limited LOCI -3 with the Early Intervention level of care will become enabled. In this instance the client will also not be able to proceed to admission as early intervention/education will be the recommended level of care without a substance use diagnosis as the focus of treatment.
